









WHAT?

The event emulates the World Café methodology to create an active learning experience based on a conversational environment in which participants reflect on the value of their interactions with the EU.

The event calls for young participants willing to reflect on EU democracy from a critical angle, exploring alternative "connections" between them and the EU beyond elections: experiencing deliberative democracy, art and cultural interactions.

A panel of experts from academia and civil society will be in charge of activating the discussion tables by elucidating on these "connections" in different phases of the session.

The aim is to fill the room with a plethora of small conversations (five people per table) that together conform a kaleidoscopic vision on alternative connections with European democracy.

Didier Caluwaerts

Assistant Professor of Public Policy (VUB)

His research interests include deliberative and participatory democracy, democratic myopia and democratic regression. He recently set up a lab experiment on deliberation and long-term thinking regarding environmental policy. Didier was awarded the 2012 ECPR Jean Blondel PhD award and the 2016 Ignace Vanderschueren PhD Prize. He is also the winner of the 2010 ECPR Dirk Berg-Schlosser award, and coorganizer of the G1000 citizens' summit (2011). In 2013 and 2014, Didier was a Democracy Fellow and a Frank Boas Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School's Ash Center for Democratic Governance and Innovation.

Her PhD focusses on the effects of Eurosceptic voting and EU-issue voting on policy congruence between political parties and voters. Broader research interests are EU democracy, voting behavior and public opinion, European elections and the European Parliament. His research interests include the politics of European integration, transatlantic relations, defence policy-making, and the ongoing redefinition of state sovereignty. He is also a Senior Research Fellow at Egmont — the Royal Institute for International Relations, and a visiting professor at the College of Europe in Bruges. As a Fulbright Schuman fellow he completed research stays at Harvard University and at the National Defense University. He sits on the scientific committee of the Belgian Royal Higher Institute for Defence. He obtained his PhD in Political Science from the Vrije Universiteit Brussel and Master degrees from the University of Bath and the University of Leuven.

Marcela Valkova considers herself a European woman, a working mother and a community leader. Born and raised behind the iron curtain in former Czechoslovakia, lived across Western Europe for the past 17 years. Most of her career, Marcela has served the European project and currently works as case handler in the European Commission in Customs Tariff department. Due to the recent political developments, Marcela decided to enter politics in order to protect the European values and threats of fragmentation of the

European family. As a political orphan, never a member of a political party, she discovered Volt, the citizen-led pan-European movement, in summer 2017. Shortly after, she became the first country lead of the Belgian chapter and co-founded the non-profit organisation linked to the political party. Currently, she is the treasurer of Volt Belgium and the lead female candidate for the up-coming EP elections 2019.

Michiel Vandevelde

Choreographer, curator, writer and editor

Michiel Vandevelde studied dance and choreography at P.A.R.T.S., Brussels. He is active as a choreographer, curator, writer and editor. As a freelance curator he worked or works for: Extra City Kunsthal, Het Bos, Bâtard festival, Z33, Precarious Pavilions. He is involved as an editor in the Disagree. magazine and he has written articles for Etcetera, De Witte Raaf, Rekto: Verso, Mister Motley, etc. From 2017 to 2021 Michiel Vandevelde is artist in residence at Kaaitheater. In his work he investigates the elements that constitute or obstruct the contemporary public sphere. He explores which other social, economic and cultural alternatives we can imagine in order to question, challenge and transform dominant logics and ways of organizing. He has been developing a variety of projects both in public space and in (performing) art institutions.

Eline Severs

Assistant Professor at the VUB - Political Science Department

Eline Severs is an assistant professor at the Department of Political Science, Vrije Universiteit Brussel. Her research interests fall within the field of democratic theory. She is especially interested in democratic representation, the relationships between civil society and democratic governance, citizens' conceptions of democracy, and what it means to include historically disadvantaged groups. Her research on the legitimacy of representative democracies seeks to shed light on the meaning of the so-called crisis of representation in contemporary democracies. Eline holds a PhD degree in Political Science from the University of Antwerp (2012). From 2012 till 2015, she was the scientific coordinator of the Policy Research Centre on Equality Policies (PRCEP) ('Steunpunt Gelijkekansen'), an inter-university research consortium funded by the Flemish Government Departments on Science and Equal Opportunities (2012-2015). It conducted policy-preparatory research for the Flemish Minister of Equal Opportunities.
